Middleborough Housing Authority September 2024

As of 8/28/24, Middleborough has been classified as

- HIGH risk for EEE
- MODERATE risk for West Nile Virus (WNV)

The Department of Public Health has said that as of 8/28, there have been 73 confirmed pools of mosquitos infected with EEE in the state, with the majority in Carver and parts of Middleborough.



In Plymouth County, the Mosquito Control District has been conducting truck-based spraying during the season in response to EEE-infected mosquitoes. However, the risk continues to be elevated. Because of this ongoing risk, an aerial spray will supplement the work already performed in Plymouth County's high-risk regions.

As of 8/28/24, parts of Middleboro were included in aerial spraying. Our three developments were not included, although they may be added in the coming days. While these mosquito control sprays are necessary to reduce human risk from EEE, they will not eliminate it.

The DPH recommends the following precautions:

- Use repellents with an EPA-registered active ingredient, according to the instructions, any time you are outdoors;
- While outdoors, wear clothing that covers your skin;
- Reschedule outdoor activities to avoid the hours between dusk and dawn;
- Check screens and repair holes or replace those that do not fit tightly and
- Reduce areas of standing water where mosquitoes breed (e.g., removing containers that hold water).



Bird Baths are not allowed on Middleboro Housing Property. Tenants are advised to remove them from the property.

POLICY REMINDERS

Laundry

For tenants using the laundry room at Riverview or Nemasket

- Rinse soiled items before putting them in the washer.
- Clean out the lint before using the dryer.
- Do Not leave clothes in the laundry room for donation!

SCAM ALERT!

Tech support scams

Scammers know that most people fear getting hacked or having their computer or phone infected with viruses. In this scam, they trick you into thinking your device has been compromised and then pressure you into downloading software that gives them remote access to your computer.

How the scam works:

- Scammers send alarming phishing emails, text messages, or even pop-up ads declaring that your device has been hacked or infected.
- The tech support phone number provided in the alert is a direct line to the scammer. Once they get you on the phone, they request remote access to your device to "fix" the nonexistent problem.
- When they gain access, they install invasive malware, spyware, or even ransomware onto your device. They can also use hacking techniques to steal sensitive data from your hard drive — such as personal and financial information, usernames, and passwords.

How to stay safe:

If you get a troubling message from a tech support team, don't click on links or respond via any contact information listed in the message. Instead, contact Apple, Microsoft, or your antivirus provider using their official websites or phone numbers.

as depression. The word "depressed" is often tossed about casually or is used synonymously with having a bad day, feeling bummed out, or experiencing temporary moments of sadness. It doesn't mean the experience of it is any less real. *Clinical* depression is often described as constant or frequent feelings of apathy, hopelessness, and

- There are approximately 600 ingredients in cigarettes. When burned, cigarettes create more than 7,000 chemicals. At least 69 of these chemicals are known to cause cancer, and many are toxic. Here are a few of the chemicals in tobacco smoke and other places they are found:
- Acetone—found in nail polish remover
- Arsenic—used in rat poison
- Benzene—found in rubber cement and gasoline
- Butane—used in lighter fluid
- Cadmium—active component in battery acid
- Formaldehyde embalming fluid
